Keep a daily log of your observations. It is suggested that you begin this activity by mid-April and continue until at least early June. Each evening during twilight, record stars and planets you can spot within 1-1/4 hours after sunset. When you see a star or planet, make a check mark in the appropriate column, or note the time you first see it. If you hear any sounds of nature, such as from birds, frogs, toads, or insects while you're out observing, list those too!
